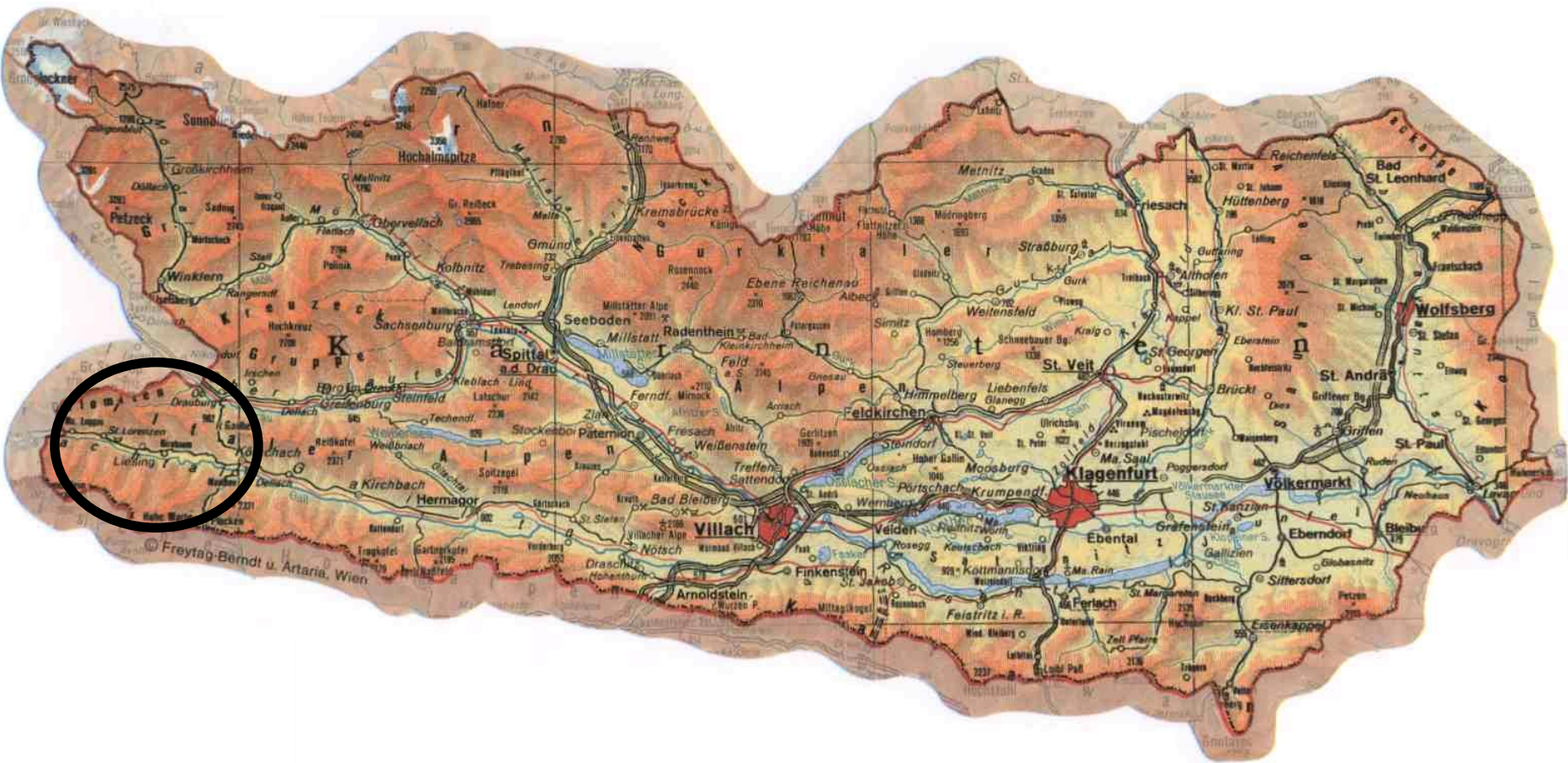

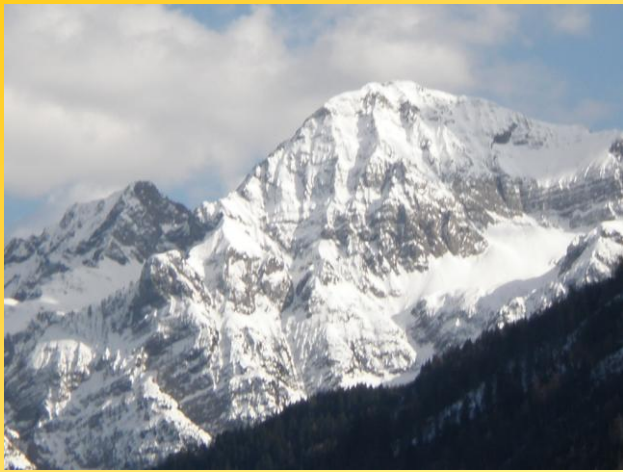

- South West Carinthia
- 190,69 km²
- ▽ Ø 1044 m Sealevel
- Length: 20 km
- Width: 6 km
- In the north: Gailtaler Alps and „Lienzner Dolomiten“
- In the south: Carnic Alps

- 1490 inhabitants
- 8 people / km²
- Most important villages:
 - Birnbaum
 - Liesing,
 - St. Lorenzen,
 - Maria Luggau
- The most natural valley since 1991



Coat of arms

- Till 1973
- Consists of four pieces
- Stands for 4 communities
- Green and silver symbolize the tourism



History

- The Lesachtal was inhabited by Slavs in 600 A.D.
- One of the first carinthian valleys that was germanised
- 1850 - creation of the municipalities
- First World War - the frontline
